CHEMICAL HANDLING **Before Using Chemicals During Chemical Use Chemical Storage** Label all containers Access Safety Data Match labels to Safety Data chemical aloves Sheets Sheets Add chemical to water ☐ Ensure adequate Follow temperature & (never reverse) ventilation ventilation requirements ■ Don't mix chemicals unless directed ☐ Rinse containers before refilling **ACTIVE WASHING SAFETY Climbing Safety Jobsite Awareness** Prevent Slips, Trips & Falls Watch footing on wet Three points of contact High-vis clothing, hearing surfaces, organize hoses, protection, safety cones, Stable ladders look ahead communicate location, sunscreen, UV-resistant clothing, Fall protection above 6 feet hats, hydration and electrolytes **EMERGENCY RESPONSE Chemical Exposure Protocol** End-of-Job Flush skin/eyes with cold water 15-20 Remove saturated clothing/PPE ☐ Inspect and replace damaged PPE minutes DO NOT neutralize first (makes it worse) Use eye wash for eye exposure Apply calcium gluconate gel for HF Get medical help if serious or irritation continues
